| <b>Expectations for the SET</b>     | Exercise equipment and practice procedures necessary to support an incident in Virginia.  |
| <b>What Occured</b>                 | Equipment was exercised and good practice was achieved during the SET. It appeared we had pretty good participation given the Covid pandemic and the approaching significant snowfall event.  |
| <b>What Went Well and Why</b>       | Again, good participation. Plenty of traffic passed successfully.   |
| <b>Improving Operation and How</b>  | While we can't control interference from other stations, the large volume of traffic on adjacent frequencies injected a significant amount of noise making passing of voice traffic on HF, at times, nearly impossible. We may want to identify numerous alternate frequencies ahead of time in future SET's to allow moving the net more easily to a clear frequency. Additionally, we didn't have any real status updates as to the progress of the incident. In the event of a real activation this will likely happen as a function of PR releases and such. In the case of a SET, it would be good if someone was interjecting status updates to the net control station to pass over the voice net. |
