Teams get together for bake sales, car washes, yard sales, bean suppers, pancake breakfasts, and many other events to raise money to support the American Cancer Society's mission of curing cancer. The American Cancer Society funds researchers early in their careers – 38 of whom have gone on to win the Nobel Prize. The American Cancer Society funded more than \$130 million in cancer research in 2003, and more than \$2.4 billion since its inception in 1946.

As part of the Relay For Life event a luminaria ceremony will be held at dusk to honor cancer survivors and to remember those loved ones who have lost their battle with cancer. The Power of Relay allows a community to grieve for those lost to cancer and to celebrate those who have survived. Almost everyone you meet can tell you a heartbreaking story about how cancer has affected his or her family. We have made progress - but there is much more to do. That's where you can put those good thoughts you had about wanting to help into ACTION!
