5 Shower Units, including 4 also offering laundry capability

2 Mobile Water Purification Units

2 Disaster Relief Temporary Child Care Units

1 Mobile Laundry Unit

2 50-kW Generator Power Units

2 Field Command and Communications Units

Approximately 100 Trained Crisis Care Chaplains
